




International Exchange Student Program

National Taipei University

An institution rich in history, National Taipei University (NTPU) began as the Taiwan Provincial College of Public Administration in 1949 to educate and train the country's business and legal elite. In 2000, National Taipei University was reorganized and restructured from the Law and Business College of National Chung-Hsin University. In 2010, NTPU has finally completed the entire relocation project, moving colleges from the downtown campus in Taipei City, to the present San-Shia main campus in New Taipei City. Over the past few decades, NTPU has traditionally played a significant and pivotal role in educating and developing the mid- and high-level talents in the areas of law, business, public administration, humanities as well as social and engineering sciences.

MBA in Finance

The MBA program in Finance with a concentration in finance at the International College of Sustainability Innovations, National Taipei University has opened its doors to international students since 2013. This innovative and completely English-taught program accepts international students who would like to share their learning experiences and interact with local students. The purpose of this program is to become a world-class incubation center of future financial leaders equipping them with a global view through Asian perspectives. The program curriculum is designed to provide students with an in-depth perspective and the analytical tools to flourish in financial services and corporate finance positions. Internship course is optional but is strongly encouraged. It requires 35 graduate credits plus a 6-credit thesis, with a total of 41 credits. The standard load is 3-4 courses per semester.

International Program on Urban Governance

The mission of the International Program on Urban Governance is to enhance our understanding of how cities work and what city managers should do to cope with the unprecedented urban challenges. Our curriculum is designed to provide insights into urban governance from global perspectives, while retaining their relevance to the current research and innovations in western countries. All the courses offered by the program are taught in English and utilize creative teaching methods such as field studies, demonstrations, and workshops to facilitate student engagement. Students are required to take 24 credits from courses (10 required credits and 14 elective credits) and complete their Master's thesis (required, no credits). Career opportunities for our graduates include city managers, landscape architects, researchers, data analysts, etc. Several forms of financial aid are available for qualified students.

Ph.D. Program in College of Electrical Engineering and Computer Sciences

The Ph.D. Program in College of Electrical Engineering and Computer Sciences is open to students who have a master's degree and are dedicated to research, where their abilities for developing practical applications in technology and high-level integration of electrical engineering and computer science will be honed. Ph.D. courses in electrical engineering and computer sciences have three major areas:

- 1. Computer Science: networking and multimedia development
- 2. Electrical Engineering: digital/analog and mixed signal IC design, computer engineering and system engineering
- 3. Communication on Engineering: wireless communications, multimedia signal processing and RF IC design Students are required to obtain 18 credits in PH.D. courses, in addition to passing a comprehensive exam and the completion of a dissertation to graduate.

1	Environment	Sanxia Campus Dormitory locates nearby the central lake inside the Campus, with the beautiful view. There are 3 dormitory buildings: The Shining-Moon Building, The Glistening-Star Building and The Dawning-Sun Building standing around a mutual playground called Roman Square.		
2	Room Furniture	There are twin rooms, triple rooms and four-bed rooms which are fully indoor lighting, sanitary equipment and balcony, good ventilation, high privacy, exclusive bathroom facilities equipped, outsourcing network provided, air-conditioning and indoor extension public utilities (lounge, room extension phone, kitchen and television, laundry, washing machine, clothes dryer and spin dryer).		
3	Public Space	 Floor planning saloons (water dispensers, TV sets and refrigerators on some floors) and laundry rooms (washing machines, dryers, dehydrators and washing tanks) to promote the connection and enhance living condition of the students. Each building has a reading room and simple kitchens (electricity power pot, induction cooker, microwave oven and sink), which is effective healthy eating. The gym and billiard rooms are set up in the dormitory building basement B1 to provide students leisure and fitness use.
