Visa information

- The Philippine Bureau of Immigration allows certain nationals to enter the country on a tourist visa and extend the length of their stay until the end of the semester. It is necessary for exchange students to obtain a Special Study Permit* (SSP) upon enrollment to the University. Please make sure to take with you all documents needed to obtain an SSP. A checklist of required documents is available on the <u>Bureau of</u> <u>Immigration</u> website.
- The University will assist you in applying for an SSP shortly after your arrival. Students are, however, responsible for applying an extension of their visas should they wish to do so.

*From the Bureau of Immigration website: "A Student Visa is issued to foreign students 18 years old and above and is taking a course higher than high school. A Special Study Permit (SSP) is issued to a foreign national below the age of 18 and/or taking non-degree courses in the Philippines. An SSP is a PERMIT, not a visa. It is issued under the Temporary Visitor's Visa of a foreign national."

Important dates

Application and nomination deadlines

- 1st semester beginning first week of August:
 - Nomination deadline: 10 May
 - Application deadline: 31 May
- 2nd semester beginning second week of January:
 - Nomination deadline: 18 October
 - Application deadline: 18 November
- The summer semester from June to July is not open to exchange students.

Proof of health and insurance

• Is insurance mandatory?

Yes. Before departure, all incoming exchange students must purchase international medical insurance covering accidents, sickness, and death.

- To what hospital does UA&P usually refer students? UA&P refers students to <u>The Medical City</u> located within the same district.)
- Amount of financial proof required for visa application: None.

In lieu of COVID-19 health protocols, students entering the Philippines must present the following:

- A negative RT-PCR test result taken no less than 72 hours prior to arrival in the country
- Proof of vaccination



FAQs

- Does the university provide transportation from the airport? Yes. Students who arrive from Monday to Friday, 8am to 6pm, within two weeks before the start of the class are provided with complimentary shuttle service.
- **Does the university have a residence?** None, but housing can be arranged by PIA prior to arrival. Serviced apartments by Millenia Suites and Exchange Regency Hotel are also an option.
- What are the types of housing available around the campus? Studio and one-to-two bedroom condominiums.
- How much does the rent around the campus usually cost? Php 20,000 to 45,000 per month.
 - Are there any compulsory meal plans? None, but if you have any dietary concerns (halal, vegan, kosher, etc.), please let us know.

How much do I need to pay?

Students classified as "Exchange Students" do not need to pay any tuition fees. There is, however, a Php10,000 miscellaneous fee to be paid upon enrollment.

• What is the estimated living expenses?

It is recommended that you set aside Php10,000-15,000 a month for your living expenses (excluding housing expenses).

Are there any other fees I need to pay?

Some foreign nationals may come to the Philippines using a tourist visa. The University will then assist them in acquiring an SSP, and will orient them in getting a visa extension or a student visa, whichever is applicable.
