Raport

The summer school 'Migration from Ukraine in media coverage - people, frames, narratives', which was held in Poznań from 21-27 May 2023, was a co-organised event between the Doctoral School of Humanities, the Doctoral School of Social Sciences, and the Doctoral School of Languages and Literatures at Adam Mickiewicz University.

The goal was an in-depth discussion on how to represent the issue of migration from Ukraine in the media after 24 February 2022.

The school's programme included lectures and workshops by lecturers from several countries. It featured both presentations and workshops aimed at an in-depth recognition of the diversity of media forms and content through the prism of which the media exposed the topic of war refugees from Ukraine. In the construction of the teaching palette, efforts were made to take into account the diverse methodologies of researching media representations that are the focus of the school's participants' attention (particularly, to draw equally on the achievements of the humanities, the social sciences and the sciences of language and literature, bearing in mind the numerous and significant links between these research branches, as well as the potential of interdisciplinarity that can be activated whenever representatives of different disciplines meet).









It should be noted at this point that the school took place in parallel with the Erasmus+ Blended Intensive Programme project 'Reinventing Dialogue in the Multimedia Age', implemented by the Faculty of Political Science and Journalism in collaboration with universities from Belgium (HOWEST University of Applied Sciences), the Netherlands (Fontys University of Applied Sciences) and Spain (University of Malaga). As part of this project, more than twenty students of journalism, journalism and social communication, and audiovisual production from four countries worked together to interview willing participants of the summer school 'Migration from Ukraine in media coverage - people, frames, narratives'. As a result, participation in the summer school for colleagues from Ukraine was also a unique visual opportunity to share their own experiences of living and doing science in a country already struggling with full-scale Russian aggression for the second year.



The school was furthermore an occasion for the cultural development of the guests, as well as a presentation of the scientific and educational opportunities provided by Adam Mickiewicz University. In this context, the guests from Ukraine could familiarise themselves with the premises base of AMU (visit to the Rector's Office, the Faculty of Political Science and Journalism, the Faculty of Educational Studies, and the Botanical Garden).









Monday (22 May) - on this day, the official opening of the school occurred, performed by the directors of the three doctoral schools co-organising the initiative - Prof. Remigiusz Ciesielski, Prof. Radosław Fiedler, and Prof. Piotr Śliwiński. The substantive part of the meeting concentrated on identifying and discussing the primary problems of Ukrainian refugees in Europe. Among the topics discussed during the lectures, the following issues were included: presentation of a book by Prof. Agnieszka Gromkowska-Melosik and Prof. Aleksandra Boroń on the experiences of Ukrainian refugee women in Poland; discussion of voices and positions of intellectuals with regard to the problem of migration from Ukraine after 24 February 2022; the issue of the role of Ukrainian refugee women in the context of problems of social inequality; analysis of the attitude of European social media towards refugees from Ukraine. On that day, there was also an introduction of the summer school participants to students from Poland, Belgium, the Netherlands and Spain, who came together as part of the Erasmus+ Blended Intensive Programme - "Reinventing Dialogue in the Multimedia Age" to conduct interviews with eager summer school attendees on "Migration from Ukraine in media coverage - people, frames, narratives". In addition, the organisers of the school provided information about AMU, the possibilities of cooperation with our university, and its place in the European academic space.

Tuesday (23 May) - the discussion on various aspects related to the presentation of Ukrainian refugees in the media space continued; the following topics were discussed on that day: the issue of different portrayals of refugees from Ukraine and Belarus in the Polish media; the problem of disinformation in the era of AI; the presentation of refugees from Ukraine in the Ukrainian media. In addition, Prof. Patrice McMahon conducted a workshop during which the school participants were introduced to best practices in conducting qualitative research. It was the day on which, the doctoral school students also planned to conduct interviews with participants of the Erasmus+Blended Intensive Programme - 'Reinventing Dialogue in the Multimedia Age'.







Wednesday (24 May) - On this day, the participants' attention was drawn to learn more about the poetic image of refugees from eastern Ukraine (a lecture with poet Lyuba Yakimchuk); in addition, Dr Nataliia Voitovych presented the work of students depicting their reaction to the outbreak of a full-scale Russian invasion in February 2022. A lecture on promoting democracy in wartime conditions was also presented that day, and a workshop on planning and implementing research projects on refugees and migration was held. The culmination of the day was the opening of the exhibition 'Art in Times of War', located in the AMU Faculty of Educational Studies.



Thursday (25 May) - attendees were introduced to the educational offerings of the IREX organisation, which develops and provides training materials to facilitate training in the talents of recognising disinformation and critically analysing pro-Russian propaganda materials. The possibility of using storytelling techniques in the process of creating media messages on the fate of refugees from Ukraine was also discussed that day. In addition, Prof. Svitlana Soroka presented a speech on the experiences of Ukrainian citizens who arrived in Poland after 24 February 2022. The day ended with a visit of Ukrainian guests to the Rogal Museum in Poznań.







Friday (26 May) - On Friday, the organisers and participants of the school summed up the results of the week's work. Professor Zbyszko Melosik spoke on behalf of the Adam Mickiewicz University authorities, thanking the Ukrainian guests for their presence and assuring them of our university's openness to further cooperation. The project coordinators, Prof. Dr. Agnieszka Gromkowska-Melosik and Dr Bartosz Hordecki presented certificates to the participants of the summer school and the students of the Erasmus+ Blended Intensive Programme. In addition, the school members visited the "Gate of Poznań" museum.

"On February 24, 2022, Russia invaded Ukraine. In the days that followed, reports kept flooding in about a conflict quickly escalating into war. Russia faced immediate backlash and condemnation from the world at large. While the war continues to contribute to an ongoing humanitarian and refugee crisis in Ukraine, a second battlefield has emerged in the online space, both in the use of social media and also in the context of information warfare. The challenge we faced was to reinvent constructive and comprehensive dialogue among individuals of various cultural and political backgrounds in the multimedia age.

It was last Monday, that students from Spain, Belgium and The Netherlands had visited AMU. The Ukrainian interlocutors had been participants of the Summer School 'Migration from Ukraine in media coverage - people, frames, narratives' which took place at AMU.

Our prime aim was to give the voice to Ukrainian PhD students who's perspectives on developing their careers in times when their country struggles with the Russian Federation's aggression, are endangered.

The overall outcome of student's teamwork has exceeded all of our expectations. Although we have had only 7 days to record the interviews, we've put our hearts and souls into this project. Now, we are taking all of this effort forward, so to spread firsthand war experiences from Ukraine and individual stories of those who are facing the most turbulent time in their careers and personal lives.


