in the academic year 2024/2025**

<b>Grade entered in the diploma of the second degree or uniform master's studies:</b>	<b>max 10 points</b>
• Very good	10 points
• Good plus	8 points
• Good	4 points
• Satisfactory plus	2 points
• Satisfactory	1 points
Candidates with the highest academic merit ('Diamond Grant', 'Pearls of Science')	10 points
NOTE: in accordance with the regulations for obtaining a doctoral degree in the discipline of theological sciences, a diploma in theology is required	
<b>Academic achievements (points for up to three recorded achievements):<sup>1</sup></b>	<b>max 15 points</b>
• Author/co-author of a scientific publication not related to the diploma thesis (scientific article, monograph, chapter in a monograph)	5 points
• Participation in research projects of scientific institutions	5 points
• Presentation of a scientific paper at an international or national conference	5 points
<b>Other achievements (points awarded for up to three documented achievements)<sup>2</sup></b>	<b>max 5 points</b>
• Awards and merit distinctions for academic achievements (awarded by the dean, rector, scientific society or the minister)	2 points
• Placement in scientific institutions	2 points
• Participation in the organization of a scientific conference	2 points
• Popularization of science in mass media or other popularizing activity in the field of theological sciences	2 points
• Activity aimed at cooperation with the social and economic environment	2 points
