

**Detailed criteria for awarding points for scientific achievements in the recruitment procedure
to the Doctoral School of Adam Mickiewicz University
in the discipline of Social communication and media**

in the academic year 2024/2025

- 1. Grade entered in the graduation diploma** (max 10 points -
 - a. good 2 points
 - b. good plus 6 points
 - c. very good 10 points

- 2. Academic achievements and scholarly activity** (max 15 points; 3 achievements -
 - a. publications¹ (papers published or accepted for publication):
 - i. an article published until 2018 in a journal included in the list of scientific journals of the Ministry of Science and Higher Education dated 25 January 2017²:
 1. list A - 8 points
 2. list C - 6 points
 3. list B - 4 points
 - ii. article published after 2018 in a journal included in the current list of scientific journals:³
 1. journal 100-200 points - 8 points
 2. journal 40-70 points - 6 points
 3. journal 20 points - 4 points
 - iii. article in a journal outside the lists of journals mentioned in section i and ii - 1 point
 - iv. monograph/editorial/chapter at level 2 in the current list of publishing houses⁴ - 10/6/4 points respectively
 - v. monograph/editorial/chapter collection level⁴ - 9/5/3 points
 - vi. monograph/editorial/chapter outside the list⁴ - 6/3/1 points
 - b. conference presentations (paper or poster)
 - i. national conferences - 2 points
 - ii. international conferences - 4 points
 - c. participation in research projects⁵:
 - i. foreign/international:
 1. leader - 10 points
 2. principal contractor - 8 points

¹ For co-authored publications, 100% of the points are awarded if the candidate is the first or corresponding author of the publication. If the candidate is the second or non-corresponding author, 50% of the points are awarded unless it is stated in the paper that the candidate's contribution is the same as that of the first author of the paper.

- 3. contractor - 6 points
- ii. national (NCN, NCBiR, FNP, MNiSW):
 - 1. leader - 8 points
 - 2. principal contractor - 6 points
 - 3. contractor - 4 points
- iii. university:
 - 1. leader - 2 points
 - 2. contractor - 1 point

3. Other activities (max 5 points; max 3 achievements):

- a. Activity in a research circle/club:
 - i. Circle/club leader - 3 points
 - ii. Active member - 2 points
 - iii. Retired member - 1 point
- b. Internships, training and study visits to scientific institutions:
 - i. max 1 month (up to 30 hours) - 1 point
 - ii. 1-3 months (31-60 hours) - 2 points
 - iii. more than 3 months (more than 60 hours) - 3 points
- c. Participation in summer schools:
 - i. national - 1 point
 - ii. international - 2 points
- d. Prizes and awards for scientific activity and academic performance:
 - i. awarded by the director of the institute or dean of the faculty (1 point)
 - ii. awarded by the university rector (2 points) (e.g. AMU Rector's "Student Laurel" Award)
 - iii. founded by state institutions and scientific societies (3 points)
 - iv. merit distinction of Adam Mickiewicz University in Poznań medal "For outstanding achievements in science and outstanding contribution to the life of the University" (3 points)
 - v. ministerial award for preparation of outstanding scientific work or participation in its preparation (3 points)
- e. Participation in the work of program or organizational committees of conferences:
 - i. local reach - 1 point
 - ii. national reach - 2 points
 - iii. international reach - 3 points
- f. Work in student media:
 - i. member of editorial board - 1 point
 - ii. head of department, publisher - 2 points
 - iii. chief editor - 3 points

4. Interview (max 50 points):

During the interview, candidates are asked to discuss five issues, concerning:

- a. knowledge,
- b. competencies,
- c. knowledge of methodology

relevant to the planned research in the discipline of social communication sciences and media. The admission committee may ask supplementary questions on each issue. The candidate will be awarded a max of 10 points for each question. The time allowed for each question is approximately 5 minutes.

5. A preliminary research project proposal (max 20 points):

The following, set in the context of the discipline of social communication and media sciences, will be evaluated:

- a. ability to formulate the research objective and present the research problem (0-5 points)
- b. innovation and originality of the research idea and ability to propose a solution (0-5 points)
- c. methodology appropriate to the discipline indicated (0-5 points)
- d. knowledge of the state of the art in research, together with basic bibliography, relevant to the objectives pursued (0-5 points)
