

Detailed criteria for evaluating candidates' achievements in the admission process for
the Doctoral School of Humanities for the academic year 2025/2026

Scientific discipline:

Theology

DIPLOMA GRADE ¹	
A candidate may receive either 0 or 5 points	
A minimum "very good" grade (or equivalent) on a second-degree diploma or a uniform master's degree diploma:	5 points
Applying for admission to the doctoral school based on outstanding scientific achievements (e.g., receiving a grant under the "Pearls of Science" competition):	5 points
In all other cases:	0 points

SCIENTIFIC ACHIEVEMENTS	
A maximum of three documented achievements will be evaluated The candidate can receive up to 20 points in total	
Author of a Scientific Monograph	10 points
Author of a Scientific Article in a journal from the Ministry of Science and Higher Education's journal list	10 points
Author of a Scientific Article in a journal not on the Ministry of Science and Higher Education's journal list	7 points
Author of a Chapter in a Scientific Monograph	7 points
Participation in Research Projects Conducted by Scientific Institutions	7 points
Presentation of a Scientific Paper at an international or national conference	7 points

¹ NOTE: in accordance with the regulations for obtaining a doctoral degree in the discipline of theology, it is required to present a second-degree diploma or a single master's degree in theology.

Implementation of an Independent Research Project funded by external sources (e.g., Diamond Grant, Pearls of Science) or university funds (e.g., ID-UB)	7 points
Editing of a Scientific Monograph	5 points

OTHER ACTIVITIES OF THE CANDIDATE

A maximum of 3 documented achievements of the candidate are evaluated

A candidate may receive a total of no more than 5 points

Awards and Prizes for Scientific Achievements (granted by a scientific society, minister, rector, or dean)	2 points
Internship at a Scientific Institution	2 points
Participation in the Organization of a Scientific Conference	2 points
Promotion of Theological Sciences through social media, publication of a popular science article, or other outreach activities	2 points
Engagement in Collaboration with the Socio-Economic Sector outside of an employment relationship	2 points

INTERVIEW

The interview may last up to 30 minutes

A candidate can receive a maximum of 50 points

Knowledge and competencies relevant to the planned research, including discipline-specific expertise	0 - 35 points
Elements of research methodology appropriate to the chosen discipline:	0 – 15 points

RESEARCH PROJECT²

A candidate can receive a maximum of 20 points

Ability to formulate the research objective and present the research problem:	0 - 4 points
Originality of the research idea and selection of appropriate problem-solving methods:	0 – 4 points

Methodology appropriate to the chosen discipline:	0 - 4 points
Knowledge of existing research, supported by a basic bibliography:	0 – 4 points
Significance of the project for the development of the chosen discipline:	0 – 4 points
