A scientific article is a peer-reviewed article published in a scientific journal or—or in the peer-reviewed materials of an international scientific conference: presenting a specific scientific issue in an original and creative, problem-oriented or cross-cutting manner; annotated with footnotes, bibliography or other scientific apparatus appropriate to the discipline. A scientific article is also a review article published in a scientific journal included in the list of journals. The following is not a scientific article: editorial, abstract, extended abstract, letter, errata and editorial note. A scientific monograph is a peer-reviewed book publication: presenting a specific scientific issue in an original and creative manner; accompanied by footnotes, a bibliography or other scientific apparatus appropriate to the discipline
