

**Detailed criteria for awarding points in the admission procedure to the Doctoral School of Adam
Mickiewicz University in the discipline of psychology
Admissions for the academic year 2021/2022**

1. Grade from the diploma of master's studies or uniform master's studies (maximum 10 points):

- satisfactory plus - 1 point
- good - 2 points
- good plus - 6 points
- very good - 10 points

2. Academic achievements and scholarly activities (maximum 15 points, 3 achievements)

- a. publications¹ (published or accepted for publication):
- i. an article published until 2018 in a journal included in the list of scientific journals of the Ministry of Science and Higher Education dated 25 January 2017²:
 1. list A - 8 points
 2. list C - 6 points
 3. list B - 4 points
 - ii. an article published after 2018 in a journal included in the current list of scientific journals³:
 1. journal 100-200 points - 8 points
 2. journal 40-70 points - 6 points
 3. journal 20 points - 4 points
 - iii. an article in a journal from outside the list^{1,3} - 1 point
 - iv. monograph/editorial/chapter at level 2 in the currently valid list of publications⁴ - 10/6/4 points respectively
 - v. monograph/editorial/chapter work at level 1⁴ - 8/4/4 points
 - vi. monograph/editorial/chapter outside the list⁴ - 4/1/1 points
- b. conference presentations (paper or poster)
- i. national conferences: 2 points
 - ii. international conferences: 4 points
- c. participation in research projects of scientific and research institutions:
- i. foreign/international:
 1. leader: 8 points
 2. principal investigator: 6 points
 3. contractor: 4 points
 - ii. national (NCN, NCBiR, FNP, MNiSW):
 1. leader: 6 points

¹ For co-authored publications, 100% of the points are awarded if the candidate is the first or corresponding author of the publication. If the candidate is the second or non-corresponding author, 50% of the points are awarded unless it is stated in the paper that the candidate's contribution is the same as that of the first author of the paper.

- 2. principal investigator: 4 points
- 3. contractor: 2 points
- iii. university:
 - 1. leader: 2 points

3. Other activities (maximum 5 points; maximum 3 achievements):

- a. Activity in a science club:
 - i. Club leader: 3 points
 - ii. Active member: 2 points

- b. internships, training and study visits to scientific institutions:
 - i. up to 1 month (up to 30 hours): 1 point
 - ii. 1-3 months (31-60 hours): 2 points
 - iii. more than 3 months (more than 60 hours): 3 points

- c. summer schools:
 - i. national: 1 point
 - ii. international: 2 points

- d. prizes and awards for scientific activity and academic performance:
 - i. the director of the institute or the dean of the faculty - 1 point
 - ii. the university rector (e.g. the Rector's award "Student Laurel") - 2 points
 - iii. awards founded by state institutions and scientific societies - 3 points
 - iv. Adam Mickiewicz University in Poznań medal "For outstanding achievements in science and outstanding contribution to the life of the University - 3 points
 - v. ministerial award for preparation of outstanding scientific work or participation in its preparation - 3 points

- e. cooperation with the socio-economic environment:
 - i. participation in student programmes aimed at cooperation with the social and economic environment and popularisation of psychology (e.g. the AMUL project, the Factory of Young Professionals) - 2 points
 - ii. voluntary work, internships and placements in external institutions related to the development of psychologist's practical skills (not included in the study plan) - 1 point

4. Interview (maximum 50 points):

- a. knowledge and competencies of the candidate relevant to the research to be undertaken and appropriate to the chosen discipline - 0-30 points
- b. elements of the research methodology appropriate to the discipline - 0-20 points

5. Research project (maximum 20 points):

- a. ability to formulate the research objective and outline the research problem - 0-5 points
- b. novelty and originality of the research idea and ability to propose a solution - 0-5 points
- c. methodology appropriate to the chosen discipline - 0-5 points
- d. knowledge of the state of the art in research, together with a basic bibliography, relevant to the objectives pursued - 0-5 points
