

**Detailed criteria for awarding points for scientific achievements in the recruitment procedure to  
the Doctoral School of Humanities in the discipline of Archaeology  
in the academic year 2023/2024**

1) Grade entered in the graduation diploma of second cycle studies or uniform master's studies – max 10 points:

- 5.00-4.91 - **10 points**
- 4.90-4.81 - **9 points**
- 4.80-4.71 - **8 points**
- 4.70-4.61 - **7 points**
- 4.60-4.51 - **6 points**
- 4.50-4.41 - **5 points**
- 4.40-4.31 - **4 points**
- 4.30-4.21 - **3 points**
- 4.20-4.11 - **2 points**
- 4.10-4.01 - **1 point**
- <4.00 - **0 points**

2) Scientific achievements (points awarded for up to three documented achievements)<sup>1</sup> - **max 15 points**, including:

- peer-reviewed scientific monograph - **10 points**
- article published in a listed journal: 100, 140 or 200 points - **10 points**
- article in a peer-reviewed journal: 20, 40 or 70 points - **7 points**
- article in a journal from outside the list or peer-reviewed monograph - **5 points**
- review- **2 points**
- participation (with paper) in an international scientific conference - **5 points**
- participation (with paper) in the national scientific conference - **2 points**
- participation in research grants (e.g. NCN, NPRH) - **3 points**
- project management (e.g. Diamond Grant) - **7 points**

3) Other activities (points awarded for up to three documented achievements )<sup>2</sup>- **max 5 points**, including:

- awards and distinctions - **1 point**
- work in a scientific circle/club confirmed by a certificate issued by the circle/club tutor – **2 points**
- work in the student government (confirmed by a certificate issued by the president of the student government board) - **2 points**
- national or international internships - **2 points**

- foreign scholarships - **2 points**
  - participation in archaeological festivals, live-action role play groups, etc. - **1 point**
- 4) Result of the interview - **max 50 points**
- a) candidate's knowledge and competences important for the planned research and relevant for the discipline – **max 35 points**
  - b) knowledge of elements of the study methodology pertinent to the discipline – **max 15 points**
- 5) Evaluation of the research project - **max 20 points**
- a) ability to formulate the research objective and to present the research problem – **max 7 points**
  - b) the research idea and the ability to demonstrate how it can be solved and how it can be implemented – **max 5 points**
  - c) evaluation of methodology specific to the discipline – **max 4 points**
  - d) evaluation of knowledge of the state of the research, including basic bibliography, relevant to the achievement of the stated objectives – **max 4 points.**
