

**Criteria for awarding points in the recruitment procedure to the  
Doctoral School of Humanities in 2024**

**Discipline of Archaeology**

- 1) GPA entered in the graduation diploma of second cycle studies or uniform master's studies – **max 10 points**:
  - GPA 5.00-4.91 - **10 points**
  - GPA 4.90-4.81 - **9 points**
  - GPA 4.80-4.71 - **8 points**
  - GPA 4,70-4,61 - **7 points**
  - GPA 4,60-4,51 - **6 points**
  - GPA 4,50-4,41 - **5 points**
  - GPA 4,40-4,31 - **4 points**
  - GPA 4,30-4,21 - **3 points**
  - GPA 4,20-4,11 - **2 points**
  - GPA 4,10-4,01 - **1 point**
  - GPA  $\leq$ 4.00 - **0 points**
  
- 2) Evaluation of the candidate's current academic performance and scientific achievements on the basis of the CV and covering letter (the candidate may indicate not more than three documented academic achievements) - **max 15 points**, including:
  - a) publications:
    - peer-reviewed scientific monograph - **10 points**
    - article published in a listed journal: 100, 140 or 200 points - **10 points**
    - article in a peer-reviewed journal: 20, 40 or 70 points - **7 points**
    - article in a journal from outside the list or peer-reviewed monograph - **5 points**
    - review- **1 point (2 points)**
  
  - b) conferences:
    - participation (with paper) in an international scientific conference - **5 points**
    - participation (with paper) in a national scientific conference - **2 points**
  
  - c) grants:
    - participation in research grants (e.g. NCN, NPRH) - **3 points**
    - project management (e.g. Diamond Grant) - **7 points**
  
- 3) Candidate's other activities (candidate may name no more than three documented achievements) - **max 5 points**, including:
  - a) awards and merit distinctions - **1 point**
  - b) work in a scientific circle/club confirmed by a certificate issued by the circle/club tutor – **2 points**

- c) work in the student government (confirmed by a certificate issued by the president of the student government board) - **2 points**
  - d) national or international internships - **2 points**
  - e) foreign scholarships - **2 points**
  - f) participation in archaeological festivals, live-action role play groups, etc. - **1 point**
- 4) Result of the interview - **max 50 points** - The scope of the interview (up to 30 minutes) includes:
- a) candidate's knowledge and competences important for the planned research and relevant for the discipline – **max 35 points**
  - b) elements of the study methodology pertinent to the discipline – **max 15 points**
- 5) Preliminary proposal for the research project - **max 20 points**, with particular emphasis on
- a) ability to formulate the research objective and to present the research problem – **max 7 points**
  - b) the research idea and the ability to demonstrate how it can be solved and **how it can be implemented** – **max 5 points**
  - c) methodology specific to the discipline – **max 4 points**
  - d) knowledge of the state of the research, including basic bibliography, relevant to the achievement of the stated objectives – **max 4 points**.
