

1. Gachon University On-campus Housing

- 1) Exchange students can apply for accommodation by submitting 'Housing Application Form' together with their exchange student application materials.
- 2) For exchange students from universities that have a dormitory fee waiver agreement with Gachon University, the waiver applies to 'Triple Rooms'. Students can may choose a 'Twin Room' instead but must pay the difference in fees.
- 3) For paying exchange students, dormitory fees are charged according to the assigned room type and length of stay, which correspond to the student exchange program duration and academic calendar.

(The fees are accurate as of 2025 and are subject to change without prior notice)

- 1) Exchange students are initially assigned a 4-month stay. If they wish to extend, they can apply for an additional 4 or 8 weeks.
- 2) If you move out of the dormitory during a period other than the regular move-out period, a deduction equivalent to two weeks' rent may apply.

※ Deposit

- ① A deposit of 100,000KRW is required upon initial move-in.
- ② In the middle of the semester, exchange students will be asked to apply for a deposit refund. At this time, the initial 100,000 KRW will be refunded to your bank account, and a new cash deposit of 50,000 KRW must be submitted.
- ③ Upon check-out, the 50,000 KRW deposit will be refunded if there are no issues.

(Since it is often difficult for exchange students to receive a bank transfer refund after leaving Korea, this mid-semester process ensures the refund can be made in cash.)

3. Information

- ◆ **Bedding**

Bedding is not provided. Students must bring or purchase their own. (Only a mattress and mattress cover are provided.)

- ◆ **Cafeteria & Meal Ticket**

The cafeteria is located in Dormitory 3.

Meals are not included in the dormitory fee; students must purchase meal tickets. (In 2025, meal tickets were available for KRW 5,500–6,000 per meal.)

- ◆ **Convenience store**

The dormitory convenience store is located on the B1 floor, Dormitory 2.

- ◆ **Wireless Internet**

Free Wi-Fi is available in most campus buildings including dormitory.

Note:

- ◆ The requested room type may be subject to change based on dormitory availability. Triple rooms are equipped with bunk beds, which may reduce personal space.
- ◆ Public facilities may not be sufficient. For example, students must apply for fridge space on a first-come, first-served basis.)

< Dormitory Rules >

1. Smoking and bringing alcohol into the dormitory are strictly prohibited, with expulsion as the penalty for violations.
2. Wearing shoes or slippers inside rooms is not allowed.
3. Touching other student's items is strictly forbidden.
4. Students must ask to the dorm office before moving rooms.
5. Violence or harassment in any form will not be tolerated.
6. The dormitory is closed from 1 am to 5 am; students cannot enter or leave during this time.
7. Visiting other students' rooms after 11 pm or any activity that disrupts study or rest time is strictly prohibited.
8. Electric appliances are not allowed in rooms due to fire risk. (Must be allowed by the dorm office in advance.)
9. Students are responsible for keeping their rooms clean, with inspections conducted at least once a month.
10. Kitchen and dining areas must be cleaned after each use.
11. Important notices must be checked on the notice board on each floor.
12. Cooking in rooms is strictly PROHIBITED
