

## Criteria for awarding points in the admission procedure to the Doctoral School

### Archaeology

- 1) grade from the diploma of the master's studies or from the diploma of a uniform master's studies – **maximum 10 points**, including:
  - 5.00–4.91 – **10 points**
  - 4.90–4.81 – **9 points**
  - 4.80–4.71 – **8 points**
  - 4.70–4.61 – **7 points**
  - 4.60–4.51 – **6 points**
  - 4.50–4.41 – **5 points**
  - 4.40–4.31 – **4 points**
  - 4.30–4.21 – **3 points**
  - 4.20–4.11 – **2 points**
  - 4.10–4.01 – **1 point**
  - ≤4.00 – **0 points**
  
- 2) assessment of the candidate's previous scientific activity and achievements on the basis of the CV and motivation letter (candidates may present no more than three documented scientific achievements for assessment) – **maximum 15 points**, including:
  - a) publications:
    - peer-reviewed scientific monograph – **10 points**
    - article in a journal from the list of journals: 100, 140 or 200 points – **10 points**
    - article in a journal from the list of journals: 20, 40 or 70 points – **3 points**
    - article in non-listed journal or in peer-reviewed monograph – **2 points**
    - review – **1 point**
  - b) conferences:
    - participation (with paper) in an international scientific conference – **2 points**
    - participation (with paper) in a national scientific conference – **1 point**
  - c) grants:
    - participation in research grants (e.g. NCN, NPRH) – **3 points**
    - project management (e.g. Diamond Grant) – **5 points**
  
- 3) other activities of the candidate (the candidate may present no more than three documented achievements) – **maximum 5 points**, including:
  - a) awards and distinctions – **1 point**
  - b) work in the academic club confirmed by a certificate issued by the tutor – **2 points**

- c) activity in the student government (confirmed by a certificate issued by the head of the student government) – **1 point**
  - d) national or international internships – **1 point**
  - e) scholarships awarded by foreign institutions – **1 point**
- 4) Result of the interview – **maximum 50 points** – the scope of the interview (up to 30 minutes) includes:
- a) the candidate's knowledge and competencies relevant to the planned research and appropriate to the discipline – **maximum 35 points**
  - b) elements of research methodology appropriate for the discipline – **maximum 15 points**
- 5) the initial research project proposal – **maximum 20 points**, with particular emphasis on:
- a) ability to formulate the research objective and present the research problem – **maximum 7 points**
  - b) novelty of the research idea and ability to propose a solution – **maximum 5 points**
  - c) methodology appropriate to the discipline – **maximum 4 points**
  - d) knowledge of the state of the research, together with a basic bibliography relevant to achieving the stated objectives – **maximum 4 points**

Total maximum **100 points**
