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**Detailed criteria for awarding points for scientific achievements in the recruitment procedure to the Doctoral School of Social Sciences in the discipline of Psychology in the academic year 2022/2023**

d. knowledge of the state of the research, together with basic bibliography relevant to the indicated aims	max 5 points
