University Name	Jeju National University
Introduction of University	Jeju National University (JNU) is the only state-designated Flagship Korean National University on Jeju, an island that has been awarded UNESCO's triple crown in the field of natural science and was dubbed a New Seven Wonders of Nature. Since its opening in 1952, JNU has worked to cultivate talent who will change the future under the vision of "a university faithful to the basics and a university prepared for the future." The nation's university assessment has named JNU as having the best educational environment in terms of the ratio of full-time professors to students and per capita educational expenses. This proves that JNU has advanced its educational environment to the next level. JNU runs 15 colleges, 1 graduate school, 3 professional graduate schools, and 6 specialized graduate schools. Particularly, it boasts of well-established teachers' colleges for potential primary and secondary teachers and a comprehensive medical education system that includes colleges specialized in medicine, pharmacy, nursing and veterinary medicine. To nurture global talent, JNU runs a customized curriculum that offers students all types of courses from foundational to advanced levels. Currently, JNU has 11,200 international students from nearly 48 countries and networks with an estimated 323 universities from more than 50 countries, including the United States. This network of global education has been fully established and students are encouraged to participate in its overseas internship program, intensive English education program, and student exchange program.

Eligibility	 Students who are enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate degree program at their home university and will remain enrolled during the exchange period in JNU. Students who have a good academic record. (Above GPA 2.7/4.3 or 80/100) Students who can communicate in English or Korean. Students who are in good health, both mentally and physically, to study in Korea for the full duration of exchange program. Students who have strong academic interest in Korea and Jeju.

List of Required Documents	 1. Student Exchange Program Application Form (signed and photo attached) 2. Study Plan 3. Letter of Recommendation (written by a professor of an affiliated department) 4. Certificate of Medical Examination (examined and issued by a hospital after January 1, 2024) 5. Certificate of Enrollment (officially issued by the student's home university) 6. Official Transcript (officially issued by the student's home university) 7. Copy of Passport (the page showing the student's photograph) 8. Proof of Language Proficiency (English or Korean) *If any 9. Digital ID photo file 10. Proof of Financial Statements*(this applies to students who are not from an OECD country) * As per the guidelines for issuing certificates of admission, universities are required to collect and store the financial statements. * This should indicate that students planning to study for 2 semesters have a minimum of 16 million KRW or more, while students planning to study for 1 semester should have a minimum of 8 million KRW or more in their possession. • Academic Classes (except for Education, Medicine, Veterinary Medicine, Law, and Pharmacy): Students fluent in Korean or those with TOPIK level 3 or higher proficiency can enroll in major and general education classes. However, some majors may require a higher level of Korean proficiency than TOPIK level 3. * (Language of Instruction) Most undergraduate and graduate courses are taught in Korean. However, there may be exceptions, especially in Liberal Education or the OIA's Exchange Student Only classes, which are conducted in English. These English-medium classes provide options for students who may not meet the Korean language proficiency requirements or prefer to study in English (please see attachment). • Korean Language Program (KLP): Exchange students have the option to enroll in the Korean Language Program (KLP), which is a full-time language course (15-17 week

Maximum Credits	 18 credits per semester for undergraduate students 9 credits per semester for graduate students *Exceptions: The maximum credit limit may not apply to the Korean Language Program (KLP) and the OIA's Exchange Student Only classes.
Tuition Fee	According to the Agreement on Student Exchange between two universities, exchange students typically pay tuition fees at their home university and are exempt from paying tuition fees at the host university.



Accommodation (JNU Student Dormitory)	 (Room Type) Exchange students are typically accommodated in double rooms with a bathroom. These rooms do not include a kitchen. (Cost) The cost of accommodation in the Student Dormitory ranges from 800,000 to 890,000 KRW per semester. The exact price may vary depending on the building, and it should be noted that this cost does not include the vacation period. *No deposit is required for the dormitory accommodation. (Bedding) Students are responsible for bringing their own bedding or purchasing it upon arrival. (Payment Procedure) Payment for the dormitory fee must be completed before students' arrival at Jeju National University. The university requests payment via wire transfer.
How to make a payment for Dormitory fee	To ensure a smooth process, students are required to complete the international wire transfer before their arrival. The invoice will be sent via email once the application is completed.
Meal Plan (JNU Student Dormitory)	Students can purchase a meal plan if they want to use the dormitory cafeteria. Korean and International cuisine meals are provided in the school cafeterias. The rate varies depending on the plan.
Health Insurance	As of March 1, 2021, all international students (holding D-2 visas) are mandated to subscribe to Korea's National Health Insurance. Subscription to the National Health Insurance is automatically initiated after foreign registration at the Jeju immigration office. However, this process typically takes around 1-2 months to complete. For students starting their Fall semester in 2024 (presumably from September to October), it's advised to bring their own overseas health insurance to cover this period as the National Health Insurance subscription may not be completed in time. The monthly cost for international students' National Health Insurance is approximately 75,940 KRW. Students are required to pay their insurance fees for the next month on the 25th of the previous month.
General Procedure	 (Nomination) The home university nominates the student to attend JNU. (Submit Required Documents) The student submits the necessary documents to their home university. (Send Documents by Email and Post) The home university sends the required documents to JNU via both email and postal mail. (Document Screening Process) JNU reviews the submitted documents as part of the application process. (Announcement of Admission Result) JNU informs the home university of the admission decision. (Send Certificate of Admission) JNU sends the Certificate of Admission to either the home university or directly to the student. Information regarding the arrival date and entry procedure, including airport pick-up details, will be provided at this stage. (Apply for D-2-6 VISA) The student applies for the D-2-6 visa at the Korean Embassy in their home country. (Send Arrival Information) The student informs JNU of their arrival details. (Arrive in Jeju) The student arrives in Jeju to begin their studies at JNU.
