SCIENTIFIC ACHIEVEMENTS		
The candidate shall indicate a maximum of 3 documented scientific achievements for evaluation. They may receive no more than 22 points in total.		
Scientific publications:		
N.1	Author of a scientific monograph or source edition, published by a ministerial-listed publishing house specializing in peer-reviewed scientific monographs:	10 points
N.2	Author of a scientific monograph or source edition, published by a non-ministerial-listed publishing house specializing in peer-reviewed scientific monographs:	5 points
N.3	Editor of a scientific monograph:	5 points
N.4	Author of a scientific article in a ministerial-listed journal or peer-reviewed conference materials - scored 70 points or higher (reviews and non-article texts, such as conference reports, receive half the points per article). Reviews and other texts that are not articles (e.g., conference reports) will be scored at half the points per article:	10 points
N.5	Author of a scientific article in a ministerial-listed journal or peer-reviewed conference materials - scored between 20 and 40 points (reviews and non-article texts, such as conference reports, receive half the points per article). Reviews and other texts that are not articles (e.g., conference reports) will be scored at half the points per article:	6 points
N.6	Author of an article in a scientific journal outside the ministerial list of scientific journals and peer-reviewed materials from international conferences in the current version. Reviews and other texts that are not articles (e.g., conference reports) will be scored at half the points per article.	5 points
N.7	Author of a chapter in a scientific monograph	5 points

Knowledge of existing research, supported by a basic bibliography	0 – 3 points
Significance of the project for the development of the chosen discipline	0 – 4 points
Risk analysis of research tasks	0 – 1 points
