

**Detailed rules for awarding points
in the admission procedure to the Doctoral School of Adam Mickiewicz University
Philosophy**

A **grade from a diploma** of master's studies or uniform master's studies – maximum 10 points:

≥ 4.9	10 points
≥ 4.8	9 points
≥ 4.7	8 points
≥ 4.1	2 points
≥ 4.0	1 point
< 4.0	0 points

Assessment of the applicant's previous scientific activity and achievements:

3 documented achievements, not more than 15 points

Article published up to 2018 in a journal included in the list of scientific journals of the Ministry of Science and Higher Education dated 25 January 2017:

List:	Number of points

C	8
B	4
Outside the list	2

Scientific articles published in scientific journals after 2018: scoring according to the Communication of the Minister of Science and Higher Education of 31 July 2019 on the list of scientific journals and peer-reviewed proceedings of international conferences, together with the number of points assigned (current at the date of application for admission to the Doctoral School).

70–100	8

Chapter in a peer-reviewed monograph published in a publishing house from the above-mentioned list – points awarded in accordance with the scoring system in force on the day of

submitting the application for admission to the Doctoral School – Level One: 4 points, Level Two: 8 points. Chapter in a reviewed monograph published in a publishing house not included in the above-mentioned list – 2 points.

Review in scientific journals, regardless of the assigned scoring of the journal – 2 points.

Participation in a research project coming from a scientific and research unit:

- (a) Foreign: 6 points
- (b) National (NCN, NCBiR, FNP, MNiSW, MEiN): 4 points
- (c) University: leader – 2 points.

Conferences with papers:

- (a) international or national – 4 points
- (b) international or national student-doctoral conferences – 3 points
- (c) local symposia – 2 points

Diamond Grant – 8 points.

Prize/award in a non-university competition for the best master's thesis: 1st place – 6 points, 2nd place – 4 points, 3rd place – 3 points, honourable mention – 1 point

Other activities of the candidate: 3 documented activities, not more than 5 points.

- Scholarship of the Minister of the Ministry of Science and Higher Education – 4 points.
- Rector's award – 3 points.
- Research trips (scholarships, e.g. Erasmus): up to 1 month – 1 point, 1-3 months – 2 points, more than 3 months – 3 points
- Summer schools: national – 1 point, international – 2 points
- Participation in the MOST project – 2 points
- Work in student government – 1 point.
- Work in student scientific movement – 1 point
- Participation in actions popularising scientific knowledge – 1 point
- Voluntary work in a public service organisation – 1 point

Research project proposal: maximum 20 points.

- Ability to formulate the research objective and present the research problem – max. 4 points
- Originality and novelty of the research idea – max. 4 points
- Ability to explain the solution – max. 4 points

- Demonstration of methodology – max. 4 points
- Knowledge of the state of research with a basic bibliography – max. 4 points

Interview: maximum 50 points.

- Knowledge and competencies – max. 20 points
- Knowledge of methodology – max. 15 points
- Ability to present a paper – max. 15 points
