

**Detailed criteria for awarding points for scientific achievements in the recruitment procedure to the Doctoral School of Languages and Literatures in the discipline of Linguistics in the academic year 2022/2023**

<b>Grade entered in the diploma of the second degree or uniform master's studies:<sup>1</sup></b>	<b>max 10 points</b>
• Very good	10 points
• Good plus	8 points
• Good	6 points
• Satisfactory plus	4 points
• Satisfactory	2 points
<b>Academic achievements (points for up to three recorded achievements):<sup>2</sup></b>	<b>max 15 points</b>
• Peer-reviewed academic article published/accepted for publication (editor's confirmation of acceptance) in a journal or collective work in the humanities	5 points
• Peer-reviewed scientific article published / accepted for publication (editor's confirmation of acceptance for publication) in a journal or collective work outside the area of humanities	3 points
• Implementation of own grant / research project financed from external sources (e.g. Diamond Grant, Pearls of Science, NCN grants)	5 points
• Implementation of own grant / research project financed from university funds (e.g. ID-UB)	4 points
• Co-contractor in a grant (named member of the grant team)	4 points
• Co-contractor in a grant (contractor without indication of membership in the grant team)	2 points
• MNiSW scholarship for learning achievements	3 points
• 1st, 2nd, or 3rd place in a national / university / faculty / institute competition for the best BA or MA thesis	3 points
• Distinction in a national / university / faculty / institute competition for the best BA or MA thesis	2 points
• Rector's award of 1st or 2nd degree for academic achievements	2 points

<sup>1</sup> In the event that the diploma grade for a second-cycle or uniform master's studies is defined in a different way (e.g. by points, percentage), the points will be awarded based on the agreement of all members of the admission committee.

<sup>2</sup> If the candidate demonstrates other forms of scientific activity than those included in the above list, the grade will be awarded based on the agreement of all members of the admission committee.

• Work on a journal editorial board	2 points

• Completion of postgraduate studies / second major (or final semester of studies in progress)	2 points
• Membership of student government, faculty, institute committees / teams / university organizations	2 points
• Popular science article published / accepted for publication (editor's confirmation of acceptance for publication)	2 points
• Published translation of a scientific / literary text	2 points
• Membership of a scientific circle/club	2 points
• Conducting workshops or a panel during scientific meetings	1 point
• Mobility within Erasmus+, CEEPUS, PROM, NAVA (other)	1 point
• Scholarships/awards from government bodies, local authorities, foundations, associations	1 point
• Co-organization of conferences, workshops, cultural events	1 point
• Supervision of foreign students	1 point
• Volunteering in associations, foundations, organizations connected with science and cultural institutions	1 point
• Other forms of popularization of literature and culture	1 point
• Dean's / Institute Director's award for activity on behalf of the department / institute	1 point
