Professor at the university's Department of Contemporary History and member of the Scientific Council of the History discipline. Her research interests focus on Polish-Ukrainian relations in the 20th and 21st centuries, with particular emphasis on the period after 1989; the history of post-Soviet states and the fate of the Polish minority in the East. She is also keenly interested in Polish foreign policy in the 20th and 21st centuries and the history of diplomacy.

Professor at the university's Department of Contemporary History and member of the Scientific Council of the discipline of History. His research interests include recent history, international relations and European integration.



### Prof. Piotr Okulewicz

Professor at the University's Department of Contemporary History and member of the Scientific Council of the History discipline. His scientific interests include the history of Greater Poland in the interwar period, with particular emphasis on the fate of the local sympathisers of Józef Piłsudski; the history of the Second Republic of Poland, especially the history of the Piłsudski camp, problems related to Polish Eastern policy in the 20th and 21st centuries, and the history of Polish and world music.

The summer school included lectures with the best teachers of Adam Mickiewicz University, who tried to present information to Ukrainian students in the most accessible way possible.
