

Detailed criteria for evaluating candidates' achievements in the admission process for the Doctoral School of Humanities for the academic year 2025/2026

Scientific discipline:
Culture and Religion Studies

DIPLOMA GRADE	
A candidate may receive either 0 or 5 points	
A minimum "very good" grade (or equivalent) on a second-degree diploma or a uniform master's degree diploma:	5 points
Applying for admission to the doctoral school based on outstanding scientific achievements (e.g., receiving a grant under the "Pearls of Science" competition):	5 points
In all other cases:	0 points

SCIENTIFIC ACHIEVEMENTS	
A maximum of three documented achievements will be evaluated The candidate can receive up to 20 points in total	
<i>Publications:</i>	
Foreign-language publication in publishing houses or journals from the ministerial list or former A, B, C, SCOPUS, ERIH journal lists	10 points
Publication in Polish in publishing houses or journals from the ministerial list or former A, B, C, SCOPUS, ERIH journal lists	5 points
Other scientific publications	2 points
<i>Active Participation in Scientific Conferences (Maximum 5 Points):</i>	
Presentation delivered in a foreign language at an international conference	3 points
Presentation delivered in a foreign language at a national conference	2 points
Presentation delivered at another scientific conference	1 point

<i>Domestic Research Internships/Trips (Maximum One Internship/Trip):</i>	
MOST program internship	1 point
Other domestic research trips	1 point for each two months
<i>Foreign Research Internships/Trips (Maximum One Internship/Trip):</i>	
Erasmus-type internship	2 points
Other foreign research internships/trips	1 point for each month
<i>Participation in Grants and Research Projects (At Least as a Contributor, Maximum 10 Points):</i>	
International projects	8 points
National projects	4 points
Local projects	2 points
Scientific Awards and Honors	3 points
Other achievements	2 points

OTHER ACTIVITIES OF THE CANDIDATE	
A maximum of 3 documented achievements of the candidate are evaluated	
A candidate may receive a total of no more than 5 points	
Work in science clubs	2 points
Organization of scientific conferences	2 points
Awards and university awards of an organizational nature	2 points
Activity in the area of culture	2 points
Artistic activity	2 points
Local government activity	2 points
Other	1 point

INTERVIEW

The interview may last up to 30 minutes
A candidate can receive a maximum of 50 points

Knowledge and competencies relevant to the planned research, including discipline-specific expertise	0 - 30 points
Elements of research methodology appropriate to the chosen discipline (i.e. culture and religion studies):	0 - 20 points

RESEARCH PROJECT¹

A candidate can receive a maximum of 20 points

Ability to formulate the research objective and present the research problem:	0 - 10 points
Originality of the research idea and selection of appropriate problem-solving methods:	0 - 3 points
Methodology appropriate to the chosen discipline (i.e. culture and religion studies):	0 - 3 points
Knowledge of existing research, supported by a basic bibliography:	0 - 2 points
Significance of the project for the development of the chosen discipline (i.e. culture and religion studies):	0 - 2 points
