**Detailed criteria for evaluating candidates' achievements in the admission process for
the Doctoral School of Humanities for the academic year 2026/2027**

Scientific discipline:
Archaeology

DIPLOMA GRADE	
In this category the candidate may receive maximum 3 points	
In the absence of a diploma grade, the average grade from the course of study is taken into account.	
“very good” or equivalent grade	3 points
“good plus” or equivalent grade	2 points
“good” or equivalent grade	1 point
applicants seeking admission on the basis of the highest quality scientific achievements (e.g. leading a project under the “Pearls of Science” programme)	3 points

SCIENTIFIC ACHIEVEMENTS		
The candidate shall indicate a maximum of 3 documented scientific achievements for evaluation. They may receive no more than 22 points in total.		
Publications:		
N.1	Peer-reviewed scientific monograph	10 points
N.2	Article in a journal from the list of journals rated 100, 140, or 200 points.	10 points
N.3	Article in a journal from the list of journals rated 20, 40, or 70 points	7 points
N.4	Article in a journal outside the list or in a peer-reviewed monograph	5 points
N.5	Review	1 point

Conferences:		
N.6	Participation (with paper) in an international scientific conference	5 points
N.7	Participation (with paper) in a national scientific conference	2 points
Grants:		
N.8	Participation in research grants (e.g., NCN [National Science Centre], NPRH [National Programme for the Development of Humanities])	3 points
N.9	Project management (excluding those already reported under the "Graduation Grade" criterion)	7 points

OTHER ACTIVITIES OF THE CANDIDATE		
The candidate shall indicate a maximum of 3 documented achievements for evaluation. They may receive no more than 5 points in total.		
I.1	Awards and Honours	1 point
I.2	Work in a science club, confirmed by a certificate from the club's scientific supervisor	2 points
I.3	Activity in student government, confirmed by a certificate from the chairman of the student government council	2 points
I.4	Domestic or foreign internships	3 points
I.5	Foreign scholarships	3 points
I.6	Participation in archaeological festivals, reconstruction groups, etc.	1 point

RESEARCH PROJECT	
The candidate may receive a maximum of 20 points	
Ability to formulate the research objective and present the research problem	0 – 4 points
Originality of the research idea and selection of appropriate problem-solving methods	0 – 4 points
Methodology appropriate to the chosen discipline	0 – 3 points
Knowledge of existing research, supported by a basic bibliography	0 – 3 points
Significance of the project for the development of the chosen discipline	0 – 3 points
Risk analysis of research tasks	0 – 3 points

INTERVIEW

The interview may last up to 30 minutes

The candidate may receive a maximum of 50 points

Knowledge and competencies appropriate to the chosen discipline	0 – 35 points
Elements of research methodology appropriate to the chosen discipline	0 – 15 points
