Visa Requirement, Process, and Fee

All non-local students are required to apply for a student visa once the exchange application is accepted by HKSYU, which can be arranged through their local sponsor (HKSYU), with the necessary supporting documents. It will normally take six weeks to process a visa application upon receipt of all the required documents. Exchange students are advised to apply as far in advance as possible.

The current student visa application fee paid to the Hong Kong Immigration Department is HK\$230. HKSYU will collect the student visa application fee from exchange students upon their arrival at HKSYU.

Normally, the Immigration Department in Hong Kong requires the following documents, though they may ask for other additional information:

- Form ID995A (http://www.immd.gov.hk/eng/forms/forms/id995a.html) completed and signed
- Form ID995B (http://www.immd.gov.hk/eng/forms/id995b.html) completed and signed by sponsor (which can normally be arranged by your university)
- Photocopy of the student's identity card and/or travel documents
- One recent photo of the student (affixed on form ID995A)
- A photocopy of the student's letter of admission from HKSYU, as well as her/his letter accepting the admission
- Evidence of the student's financial standing (bank statements, passbooks, proof of scholarship funds, etc.). If someone is sponsoring the student financially, that person must submit a declaration stating her/his relationship to the student, her/his intention to support the student's study and living expenses and her/his financial standing
- Evidence of the student's accommodation arrangement in Hong Kong e.g. an undertaking that the sponsor is prepared to provide accommodation to the applicant

Chinese residents of the Mainland should submit their applications to the Immigration Department through HKSYU (the sponsor) granting the acceptance. Other non-local students can submit their application forms and supporting documents in one of the following ways:

- By post directly or through the local sponsor in the HKSAR to the Receipt and Despatch Sub-Unit, Hong Kong Immigration Department, 2/F, Immigration Tower, 7 Gloucester Road, Wan Chai, Hong Kong;
- Applicants residing in overseas countries or territories may submit their applications in person to the nearest Chinese diplomatic and consular mission in their place of domicile; or
- Foreign passport holders living in the Mainland China may submit their applications to the

Immigration Division of the Office of the Government of the HKSAR in Beijing.

If a student takes up study in a full-time locally-accredited local or non-local post-secondary programme, s/he will normally be granted a length of stay in line with the normal duration of her/his study programme, subject to a maximum period of six years upon entry and the validity of the travel document held. For student studying other courses, s/he will normally be granted permission of stay for 12 months upon entry or in accordance with the duration of her/his study, whichever is shorter.

A student will be removed for having overstayed, it is necessary for student to renew her/his visa within four weeks before her/his old one expires.

Mandatory Health / Medical Insurance

Non-local students are required to have suitable and adequate insurance for the entire period of their study at HKSYU. The insurance should cover, but is not limited to, travel, personal accidents, medical expenses (accident and non-accident), hospitalization and emergency evacuation/repatriation. Exchange students will be required to provide proof of adequate health insurance coverage before their arrival.

Living in Hong Kong

Climate Hong Kong's climate is sub-tropical, tending towards temperate for nearly half the year. There are four seasons all the year around: cold and dry winter, unstable and wet spring, hot and humid summer, and warm and pleasant autumn. The rainy season in Hong Kong is from May to September. Typhoons usually occur during the summer.

During November and December, there are pleasant breezes, plenty of sunshine and comfortable temperatures. January and February are relatively cloudier, with occasional cold fronts followed by dry northerly winds. The temperatures may occasionally drop below 10°C in urban areas.

Food / Meals, Leisure, Transportation, and Personal Items Exchange student should allow for HKD3,000 to HKD5,000 (USD390 to USD650) per month for living costs other than accommodation. Please note that the estimation is a point of reference for preparation purposes only.

Majority of exchange students do not have a bank account in Hong Kong. Therefore, before an exchange student comes to Hong Kong, s/he may consider to carry travellers cheque or your local currency to exchange local cash at the airport or other foreign exchange providers. Besides, it is advisable to prepare HKD10,000 (USD1,200) – HKD20,000 (USD2,500) in cash for her/his first two months living cost in Hong Kong, including cost on accommodation, textbooks or other additional necessities.

Under normal circumstances, exchange students will not open a local bank account in Hong Kong just for the exchange period, especially for those coming for exchange for one semester only. If an exchange student really wishes to have a bank account to be opened in Hong Kong, s/he will be requested by the bank to have at least HKD5,000 (USD650) to be deposited in the account throughout the whole exchange period. Having said that, only a small number of local banks will provide such service to exchange students.
