## Raport

From 19 to 25 February, the MISHiS (Interdisciplinary Individualised Studies in the Humanities and Social Sciences) summer school entitled 'Across disciplines: How to study in an interdisciplinary framework' was held as part of the 'Solidarity with Ukraine - European Universities' project.

Participants in the school were students, doctoral students and lecturers from eight Ukrainian partner universities of the Adam Mickiewicz University in Poznań.







Courses at the Dębina Palace were conducted by lecturers from Interdisciplinary Individualised Studies in the Humanities and Social Sciences (Prof. Rafał Dymczyk, Prof. Aleksander W. Mikołajczak, Prof. Konrad Dominas), Liberal Art and Sciences (Prof. Łukasz Różycki), the Centre for Advanced Technologies (Prof. Jakub Rybka) and Dr Kostiantyn Mazur, representing the AMU International Relation Centre. During the lectures and workshops, students and doctoral students had the opportunity to learn not only what interdisciplinarity in research entails but also to become acquainted with several such projects conducted at AMU.



During a visit to the **Faculty of Polish and Classical Philology of Adam Mickiewicz University**, guests from Ukraine dressed in national costumes to **honour the opening of the exhibition 'Ukraine 2022-2023'**, sparking vivid attention among the attendees.

The majority of the group were females, as men between the ages of 18 and 60 were not allowed to leave Ukraine. For this very reason, the coordinator of the school on the Ukrainian side and lecturer and director of the Polish Cultural and Educational Centre, Pavlo Tychyna Uman State Pedagogical University, was unable to leave his country and come to Poland.









In addition to participating in specially designed teaching activities, a significant amount of time was spent answering questions from our Ukrainian partners about the possibilities of studying at our university and collaborating to increase mobility. A presentation on the EPICUR consortium and the potential opportunity to participate in remotely delivered lectures was met with great enthusiasm.

It pleased those responsible for the EPICUR offer at our university, as discussions have been ongoing in recent weeks regarding the stretching of this consortium's services to both Ukrainian topics and potential access to remote classes for Ukrainian students.
