Originality of the research idea and selection of appropriate problem-solving methods	0 – 4 points
Methodology appropriate to the chosen discipline	0 – 3 points
Knowledge of existing research, supported by a basic bibliography	0 – 3 points
Significance of the project for the development of the chosen discipline	0 – 3 points
Risk analysis of research tasks	0 – 2 points

**The candidate may receive a maximum of 50 points**
