Eligible Students	Students must first be nominated by their home universities. Undergraduate and graduate students are eligible to apply. However, graduate students are required to provide a letter of recommendation from a JBNU faculty member with their applications.
Duration of Exchange	An exchange period can last for one or two semesters.
Language Proficiency Requirements	None. Students with Korean language proficiency may enroll in any courses taught in Korean (TOPIK level 3-4 recommended). All students are welcome to enroll in Korean language classes or in courses taught in English at JBNU.

Enrollment Minimums and Maximums	<p>JBNU offers a wide range of courses taught in English for its international students. A list of courses that have been taught in non-Korean languages (primarily English) during prior semesters at JBNU is available on the OIA website at https://ioffice.jbnu.ac.kr and can be provided upon request.</p> <p>Two schools within our Global Frontier College operate English-Track programs and provide major coursework taught in English. Specific courses operated by these schools in any given semester will vary.</p> <p>The School of International Studies https://tsis.jbnu.ac.kr/</p> <p>The School of International Engineering and Science https://wz3.jbnu.ac.kr/sites/sieseng/index.do</p> <p>The JBNU Office of International Affairs also organizes a special program of courses taught in non-Korean languages (primarily English) in a wide range of subject areas. Typically, 20 to 30 such courses are offered by the OIA each semester.</p> <p>Major courses taught in English are also offered by various departments and colleges throughout JBNU. Such courses are taught at the discretion of faculty and will vary each semester. Typically, about 150 such courses are offered in any given semester.</p> <p>Students will be able to easily search for and enroll in courses being taught in English or other non-Korean languages during course registration periods.</p> <p>Courses at JBNU typically award 3 credit hours. Undergraduate Student Minimum-Maximum enrollment per semester: 6-18 credit hours Graduate Student Minimum-Maximum enrollment per semester: 3-9 credit hours</p>

Korean Conversation Course (non credit-granting)

Course Description	This special course is offered to undergraduate and graduate students at various Korean proficiency levels (1-5) and does not grant university credit. It aims to improve students' Korean language skills through the discussion of various topics related to everyday life and to enhance students' understanding of Korean culture.
Course Fee & Schedule	450,000 KRW / semester 70 hours of instruction are offered in Spring and Fall semesters for one hour per day over 14 weeks.

University Housing

'Chambit' Dormitory for International and Exchange Students	<p>Exchange students are guaranteed dormitory placement at Chambit Dormitory if they request it.</p> <p>Dormitory fees include accommodations and 3 meals per day from university food services on weekdays (weekend meals are also available but must be purchased separately).</p> <p>Dormitory rooms are double occupancy with private bathrooms.</p> <p>Dorm amenities include a fitness room, computer lab, reading room, lounge, and laundry room.</p>
Dormitory Fee	About 1,300,000 KRW / semester, including 3 meals from Monday to Friday every week
Off-campus Housing Assistance	The OIA does not provide off-campus housing assistance.
