Jacek Kubiak

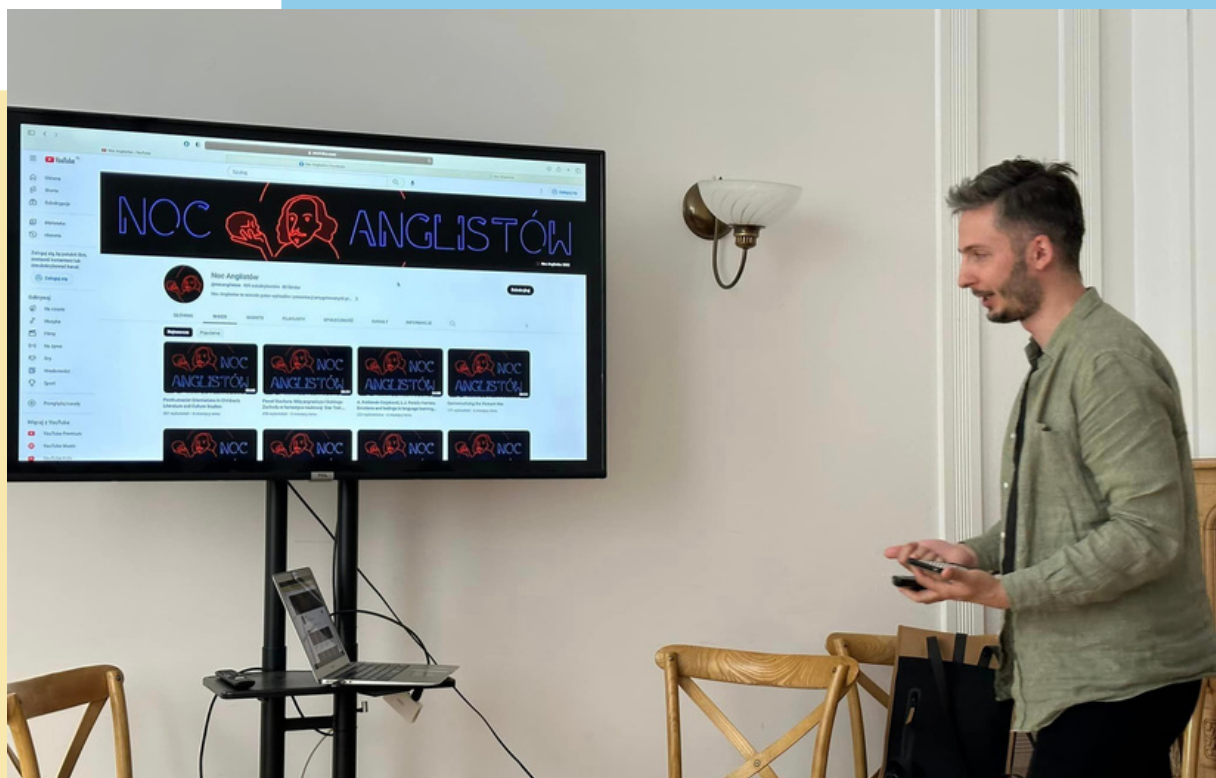

Raport

A summer school for Ukrainian scholars focusing on **science communication** was held at Adam Mickiewicz University, Poznan, between **11-17 June 2023**. The school brought together representatives from **24 Ukrainian universities**.

The **first day** was dedicated to **learning about the history, structure and university's traditions**. The participants were introduced to the **fundamental concept of science communication, the basic principles of such communication, its objectives and ways of implementation**. In gratitude to the organisers, the school participants **donated Ukrainian books to the university library**.



On **the second day**, participants learnt how to **popularise science among people** from different backgrounds, how to **make science attractive** to everyone, **organise large-scale science festivals** and **promote scientific activities**. They **worked in groups**, developing and presenting mini-projects. The day ended with a Scandinavian walk, games and competitions!



The **third day** of school was dedicated to **creating science podcasts, uploading them to different platforms and promoting them online**. There was exciting information on **documentary cinema**, the **cinematography experience** and its role in science communication. The day ended with a bonfire, fried sausages and engaging communication!



The **fourth day** was focused on a discussion on the **problem of bilingualism in the upbringing and education of children**. Polish teachers shared their experiences in organising and running fascinating events, including the English Speakers Night, quizzes and quests.

On **the final day** of the School, **participants toured several academic buildings at AMU**, visited the **university's radio and TV studio** and **recorded short videos and podcasts!** The day ended with a **tour of Poznan**, new insights, vivid emotions and delicious coffee!
