Raport

The summer school 'Presidential rhetoric in Ukraine - leadership, channels, audiences', held in Poznań and Kołobrzeg from 4-10 June 2023, was an event organised by the Faculty of Political Science and Journalism of the Adam Mickiewicz University.

The aim of the meeting was an in-depth discussion on the development of presidential rhetoric in independent Ukraine, particularly after 24 February 2022. The school's programme featured lectures and workshops by lecturers from several Polish and Ukrainian universities. It included both lectures and workshops directed at the in-depth recognition of the most relevant and characteristic phenomena in contemporary Ukrainian presidential rhetoric. The classes were designed to encourage critical reflection, as manifested in the school's participants' identification of strengths and weaknesses, and the opportunities and threats that arise from the evolution of presidential oratory in Ukraine. In particular, the course of the school addressed the transformation of Ukrainian presidential rhetoric under the conditions of a full-scale Russian invasion. In this context, the participants of the school paid particular attention to analysing the phenomenon of Volodymyr Zelenky's rhetoric, both in its version addressed to Ukrainian and international audiences.









In addition, the school was an occasion for the cultural development of the guests, as well as a presentation of the scientific and educational opportunities offered by AMU. In this context, the Ukrainian guests were able to familiarise themselves with the facilities and educational offers of the Faculty of Political Science and Journalism at Adam Mickieiwcz University.



From Tuesday (6 June) to Saturday (10 June), the summer school was held in Kołobrzeg. The trip to this town was an occasion to introduce the school participants to the cultural and natural values and history of Polish Pomerania.









Monday (5 June) - this day marked the official opening of the school, performed by the Dean of the Faculty of Political Science and Journalism of Adam Mickiewicz University, Prof. Andrzej Stelmach. The substantive part of the session focused on identifying and discussing two issues: the tradition of presidential press photography in Ukraine and the problem of disinformation and the deformation of the public image of the Ukrainian President carried out by entities generating pro-Kremol propaganda. The culmination of the day was the participation of the summer school attendees in the AMU charity concert "With One Voice with Free Ukraine".


Tuesday (6 June) - on this day, the school participants travelled from Poznań to Kołobrzeg. Upon arrival at the seaside, accommodation was provided, and the guests from Ukraine attended an integration workshop led by Dr. Jolanta Vogt-Hajder.







Wednesday (7 June) - Attendees had the opportunity to listen to two lectures guiding possible directions for designing research on presidential rhetoric in Ukraine. The first lecture - concerning potential ways of analysing presidential messages in Poland - was presented by Prof. Danuta Kępa-Figura (Maria Curie-Sklodowska University). The second lecture, on American theories of presidential rhetoric, was given by Dr. Anna Bendrat (Maria Curie-Sklodowska University). In the evening, members of the summer school toured the Kołobrzeg lighthouse.



Thursday (8 June) - Presidential rhetoric performed by President Volodymyr Zelensky became the subject of analysis on this day. Professor Barbara Sobczak discussed the ethos and pathos of speeches by the Ukrainian head of state, while Dr Bogdana Nosova (Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv) introduced current Ukrainian presidential rhetoric as a strategic resource. In addition, the summer school participants were oriented that day to the educational offerings of the IREX organisation, which develops and provides training materials to promote the teaching of skills in recognising disinformation and critically analysing pro-Russian propaganda materials. The workshop on IREX's offer was led by Nikolai Sokolski, MA, and Vladyslav Zinichenko, MA. In the evening, summer school participants took part in a marine excursion.







Friday (9 June) - On Friday, a delegation from the Faculty of Journalism, Ivan
Franko National University of Lviv provided a detailed report on the public
speeches made by the Ukrainian president and his wife, Volodymyr and Olena
Zelenski, in many contexts after 24 February 2022. In addition, the discussion
included research into particular aspects of Ukrainian presidential rhetoric as a
potential subject for BA, MA and PhD theses. In conclusion, Bartosz Hordecki,
Ph. D., outlined the horizon of the research and project opportunities that Polish
and Ukrainian universities can jointly pursue concerning presumptive
communication in Ukraine. The organisers summarised the effects of the week's
work and discussed plans for the future. Certificates were also presented to the
participants of the summer school.

"From 4 to 10 June, 3rd year students of the Department of New Media, Valeria Buniak, Anna Dmytriv, Nicoletta Miriavets, Alina-Maria Chernyk, Liliia Sokulska, jointly with their supervisor, Associate Professor Yuliana Lavrysh, participated in the Summer School "Presidential rhetoric in Ukraine - leadership, channels, audiences", supported by the Faculty of Political Science and Journalism of Adam Mickiewicz University (Poznan-Kolobrzeg).

Today, for almost 2 hours, the students presented their research "Communication of President Volodymyr Zelenskyi through the prism of new media", which they had been working on for a whole semester. The research empirically includes 90 speeches by the President to parliaments around the world, 50 speeches of internal communication with Ukrainians, about 50 speeches at festivals and cultural events, as well as monitoring of Olena Zelenska's speeches as an additional communication segment in the focus of social networks and websites.

The summer school "Presidential Rhetoric in Ukraine: Leadership, Channels, Audience" for Ukrainian students has come to an end. Lectures by leading Polish experts in rhetoric were followed by vivid speeches by Ukrainian researchers.

There was a sense of disbelief at the news about the Kakhovka hydroelectric power station, which turned into even greater feelings of anger and desire for victory.

Several times, the audience was "screaming" with air raid warnings from Ukrainian cities: Chernivtsi, Mykolaiv, Kyiv, Zhytomyr, Kharkiv... Everyone stood still waiting for the alarm to go off, telling their Polish colleagues what was happening.

There were also the sunsets over the Baltic Sea, which only strengthened the desire to meet the sun over the sea in Crimea or Berdiansk.

Finally, there were Ukrainian songs - lots of them. The final "Chervona Ruta" after the presentation of certificates united all the participants. The project was over.

New joint projects and research are ahead. Ahead is the fight against "no matter what".

And victory.




